Round 4 report (26-02-10)

U18 Division

Randwick recorded 5-0 wins against Cam/Dursley and Rednock B to extend their lead but were very close to losing their 100% record. For Cam/Dursley, 12 year old Harry Gwilliam came from 0-2 down against Will Sadlier only to lose 10-12 in the fifth and then after going 2-0 up against Declan Fardon somehow contrived to lose the next three. Joe Browning also played well taking a game from Will and only narrowly losing to Declan 7-11, 10-12, 13-15. A good win for Joe Woodley against Mark Attwood was the only point for Soul Cal as they lost 1-4 to Thornbury with Joe Constable in good form. They fared better against TKS A winning 3-2 where the losers points came from the in-form Dan Ind. Coming from 0-2 down, Tom Watts played well against Dan to take the third before losing out 1-3 TKS A suffered another 2-3 defeat this time against Wynstones. For TKS, Harry Gardiner made Oscar Costelloe fight hard before losing 1-3. Harry also went down against Ollie Williams and is still without a win in the tournament but on this evidence it can't be long coming. Oscar Costelloe took the first game against Dan Ind and briefly threatened an upset but Dan came back to win 3-1 and after beating Ollie Williams has now moved up to third place in the averages. Wynstones took the doubles to win the match

The battle of the Rednock teams ended up with a 4-1 victory to the A team but it was closer than the score suggests. Steve Crowcombe beat Ben Edwards 12-10, 11-9, 14-12 and Nick Kendall 11-6, 12-14, 17-15, 11-4. Aaron Taylor also beat Nick Kendall but lost to Ben Edwards in another close encounter 12-14, 9-11, 13-11, 7-11. Aaron and Steve then combined to win the doubles.

Rednock A were no match for Cam/Dursley losing 0-5 and Rednock B found Randwick A too hot to handle also going down 0-5

Thornbury kept up the pressure on second place Cam/Dursley with a 5-0 win against Wynstones. For the losers the improving Oscar Costelloe took the second game against Joe Constable and narrowly lost the third before eventually losing 9-11, 11-9, 10-12, 7-11
